Lezyne's 1000-lumen front light has eight modes from its two LEDs, from a minimal 15L emergency light (with a claimed 87 hour run time) to the full whack 1000L 'Overdrive', which gave us 80 minutes before the beam weakened.

You're more likely to use the second highest 500L setting, which gave us just under three hours, or one of the two flashing modes. It's waterproof to IP7 and the single top-mounted switch changes colour to let you know remaining battery life.

The strap is the familiar chunky affair and is secure, reasonably easy to attach and remove, but not quite as stable as ratcheted straps. If you like to run with a daylight flash this is a tough little light with some sideways illumination.

The KTV Pro 75 is one of the more powerful rear lights here. It has a large lens with a 270-degree spread and generally fits easily to different shaped seatposts. Unusually, you charge this by plugging the light directly into a USB socket. We managed just shy of the claimed four hours on the 20L setting.

This pairing is versatile, bright enough for unlit routes and not excessively priced.
